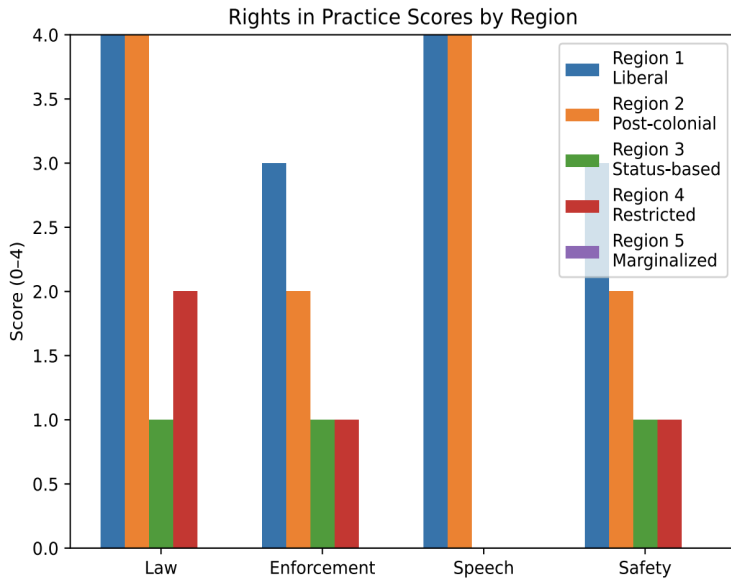

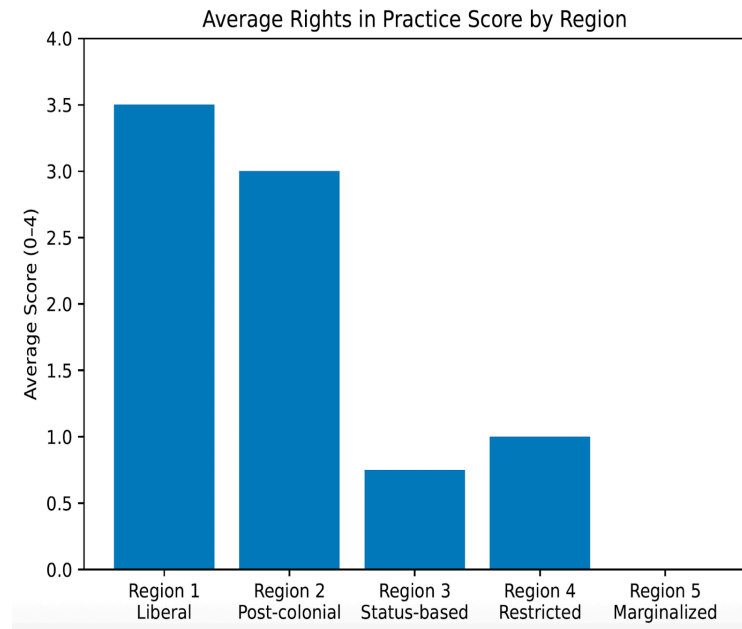
These graphs display the data above. Use them to complete Student Worksheet #3: Black Rights in Practice Practice Around the World - Analyzing Our Data

*This graph compares how rights function within each region across four indicators: Law, Enforcement, Free Speech, and Safety. Each bar represents how strong or weak that system is in practice. Differences between bars show where rights are protected and where they break down.*



*This graph shows the overall average score for each region. The average combines Law, Enforcement, Free Speech, and Safety into one number. Lower averages indicate that rights are harder to use in daily life.*
